The best practice/intervention has applicability in a region	x			The community training model for health and social service providers was part of a one year project (2009-2010) which focused on four at risk ethnocultural communities (Chinese, Egyptian, Filipino, and Vietnamese) in five Canadian provinces/ six cities. (Vancouver, Calgary, Winnipeg, Toronto, Montreal and Ottawa> 24 healthcare providers were trained – 4 from each community in each city.
he best practice/intervention shows evidence of “scale up” ability/transferability/adaptation	x			Health care providers successfully used the training model for training others at the workplace and in the community settings with minor adaptations such as translating the power point into their own language in addition to French and making it more visual with pictures etc and resources relevant to their communities. The 24 lead trainers have trained over 400 individuals and suggested that if the guide was available in multiple languages they could have had greater outreach.
The best practice/intervention has utilized a program evaluation process	x			An exhaustive evaluation using PHAC’s PERT questionnaire was conducted. The overall evaluation was very good. Recommendations included: continue training languages and provide the guide and other resources in different languages.
